# Maui / Lahaina Wildfire Relief



Annually, in conjunction with our congregation's budgeting process, our Church Council makes a prayerful decision about how best to utilize your gifts in service to God's world. For the past 15 years, that decision has included a commitment to dedicate 10% of our Offerings to "Giving Beyond Ourselves". Those funds (roughly \$30,000 per year) represent our commitment to stewardship and

sharing. And they become a tangible expression of the love God calls us to share with neighbors both locally and globally.

In recent years, a portion of those funds have been allocated to our "Urgent Outreach" account, to be used to quickly respond as a congregation in times of great need. In the days immediately after the horrific wildfire that devasted the beautiful community of Lahaina, we were able to gift \$2000 from our "Urgent

Outreach" account to the ELCA church nearest the epicenter of that fire, Kihei Lutheran Church on Maui. Those funds, combined with other gifts from friends and members of our congregation, are now being used to support that local congregation's work in both recovery and restoration efforts.

As Kihei Lutheran's own Church Council President reported, "Our congregation is filled with aloha and love. This love has been especially shown this month with the outreach to our local communities as a response to the wildfires. Your donations have all been so gratefully received by our community. Our Community Outreach team will continue to minister to those who have been affected by the fires. We have established a

dedicated Maui Fires fund for those monetary donations that have been received. The Church Council will be working together to oversee the distribution of these funds. Mahalo!"

# **Education Opportunities Abound!**

Education isn't JUST for the young, but our younger/ youngest members and friends do have a place in the education life of our congregation. Key to that are the opportunities listed below.

# **Sunday School**

Elementary and Preschool aged kids are invited to join in our twice-per-month Sunday School program. The Sunday School day begins with kids joining the rest of the congregation in worship up until the completion of KidTalk, at which time they're invited to join their teachers and classmates in the Center for Ministry for a learning time focused on making the stories of the Bible relevant to them. Older students who've completed Communion Instruction are then invited to return to the Sanctuary to share Holy Communion with their teacher and fellow students, while younger students are invited to await the arrival of their parents in the Center for Ministry at Coffee Fellowship time.

The tentative first trimester of Sunday school dates for 2023/24 are as follows:


September 10 and 24 October 8 and 22 November 5, 19 and 26 December 10

#### **FaithBuilders**

'FaithBuilders' is the name of our youth faith development ('Confirmation') program. This program is designed to create opportunities for students to ponder life's biggest questions, develop meaningful friendships, discover the adventure of faith, and have some "serious" fun. When parents and other adults ask us if Faith Builders is like "Confirmation Class," our standard answer is, "It's so much more than just that!" Students in the current FaithBuilders cohort have almost completed their journey through the Bible with Pastor John, and will be invited to affirm their faith later on this Fall!

Although the question of 'What is the right age for Faith-Builders?' varies by student, the curriculum is designed with Middle School and early High School aged students in mind. Knowing that kids' schedules can be so very crowded these days, we try hard to negotiate a schedule that can accommodate all of our FaithBuilders participants.

Normally, the Sierra Pacific Synod (the consortium of ELCA churches in Northern California and Northern Nevada) gathers in Assembly each Spring to be about the shared business of the church. Due to the traumatic resignation of Bp. Meghan Rohrer at the close of last year's assembly (and the appointment of Pastor Claire Burkat as our Interim Bishop), a decision was made to postpone the 2023 Assembly to the Fall so as to allow some time for healing and 'normalcy'.

The 35th Assembly of the Sierra Pacific Synod takes place on the weekend of September 15-17 in Burlingame, CA. Our congregation will be represented at that gathering by our President Fred Schroeder, our Vice-President Joan Kiekhaefer, Donald Eismann and Bethany Valentine, as well as Pastors John Valentine and Pam Schaefer Dawson.

The gathering focuses on the theme "Broken, yet Whole," drawing on 2 Corinthians 13:11. This theme names our brokenness, while also lifting up the work of shared healing, ministry and restoration. As we hear in Paul's letter to the Corinthians going through conflict, "Finally, siblings, rejoice. Strive for full restoration, encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you."

The primary focus of the Assembly will be the election of a new bishop. The discernment process for the next bishop began at a series of Conference Gatherings in the Spring, and will conclude on Sunday, September 17th, with the final ballot for the election of a bishop. It is noteworthy that our own Pastor John Valentine was identified as a possible 'pre-nominee' for Bishop. As such, his name will be listed among the nine initial candidates for that burdensome and challenging role in our Synod.

We invite the Holy Spirit to be present with each of our six Voting Members (and all of those gathered) as together they work to discern whom it is that God is calling to serve as the next Bishop of our Synod.
