#### **GETTING IN THE ADVENT SPIRIT**

It's the season of Advent. A time to get ready. Four weeks to prepare for the coming of the One who changes everything. Perhaps no one articulated the significance of Advent as succinctly as the German Lutheran pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer. As he awaited his martyrdom in a Nazi prison camp in the waning days of World War Two, Bonhoeffer wrote:



Our whole life is an Advent, really. A time of waiting for the ultimate, for the time when there will be a new heaven and a new earth, when all people will be brothers and sisters.

It's actually quite remarkable that we face the thought that God is coming so calmly. We have become so accustomed to the idea of divine love and of God's coming at Christmas that we no longer feel the shiver of fear that God's coming should arouse in us. We are indifferent to the message, taking only the pleasant and agreeable out of it and forgetting the serious aspect, that the God of the world draws near to the people of our little earth and lays claim to us.

The coming of God is truly not only glad tidings, but first of all frightening news for everyone who has a conscience. For it is only when we have felt the terror of the matter that we can then recognize the incomparable kindness. God comes into the very midst of evil and of death, and judges the evil in us and in the world. And by judging us, God cleanses and sanctifies us, comes to us with grace and love. God makes us happy as only children can be happy.

God wants to always be with us, wherever we may be — in our sin, in our suffering and death. We are no longer alone; God is with us. We are no longer homeless; a bit of the eternal home itself has moved unto us. Therefore we adults can rejoice deeply within our hearts under the Christmas tree, perhaps much more than the children are able. We know that God's goodness will once again draw near. For — yes — Jesus comes in judgment, but Jesus also comes in grace.

May these days of Advent waiting be filled with the angelic promise: "On earth peace to those on whom God's favor rests."

## Ministry Partner Update: Holy Shepherd Community Preschool

'Holy Shepherd Community Preschool' began operation in June of 2023 — melding the communities of Holy Shepherd Christian Preschool and St. Mark's Preschool into a single new program. Even though the construction of our new preschool facilities is still pending (see the box to the right), we'd be remiss not to celebrate some of the GREAT things that are happening already!

Preschool Liaison (and congregation vice-president) Joan Kiekhaefer is happy to report that November witnessed the launching of our new preschool Chapel program — "Songs and Stories with Pastor John"! That weekly program — which takes place in the sanctuary

on Wednesday mornings — invites our kids to discover what it means for them to be children of God. "Songs and Stories with Pastor John" is one way in which we envision utilizing our preschool program to live into our mission of "Building Up Households of Faith!"

Because November is a season of thankfulness in our community, Pastor John invited the kids to sing a couple of 'thankful' songs and to hear of Jesus' familiar interaction with the ten healed



lepers, only one of which came back to say 'Thank you'. The most memorable part of that first chapel session occurred when Pastor John was introducing the Bible story and talking about who Jesus was, when one particularly energetic preschooler shot up his hand and excitedly blurted out "I know Jesus!"

## Preschool Construction Update!

Tom Gilberston reports that Chris Gilman — our project architect — submitted a revised set of construction plans to the County Building Dept. during the first week of December! The Building Dept. had flagged our first set of submitted plans as being out of compliance with emergency egress rules, but the revised plans address the County's concerns. 



# FROM THE FINANCE DESK



In last month's edition of the Shepherd's Staff, Pastor John wrote an article about the 'whys' of giving — reminding us that your gifts matter to the church, your gifts matter to God and your gifts matter to you. This month, the folks from the Finance Team would like to help you better understand some of the 'hows' of giving in our community.

Giving to support the work of the Church and the efforts of our particular congregation is a good thing. We're blessed by your gifts — and we strive as a community of faith to use those gifts in ways that best reflect our missional priorities. But 'how' we give is as individual as we are:. The following 'glossary of giving' is intended to help you determine how you might best become a 'cheerful giver'.

**'Current/Benevolent Giving'** are those gifts received to support our congregation's budget and missional priorities. This year, a full 10% of our 'Current/Benevolent Giving' is shared with our ministry partners, including:

- the Sierra Pacific Synod and the ELCA (2.8%)
- Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (.5%)
- Lutheran Social Service of Northern California (.5%)
- International Health Partners / Tanzania (1.0%)
- Rancho Santa Marta / Mexico (1.0%)
- New Life Band / Tanzania (1.0%)
- Loaves & Fishes / Admin. Support (1.0%)
- Loaves & Fishes / Meal Augmentation (.4%)
- Winter Nights Homeless Family Shelter (.4%)
- Holy Shepherd Community Preschool Startup (1.0%)
- Our "Urgent Outreach" Fund (.4%)

'Non-ELCA Giving' involves offerings and gifts received from those who wish not to support denominational ministry efforts. These funds are NOT counted when determining our "Giving Beyond Ourselves" allocations. (If you wish to give in this way, you must reach out to Lisa Verley, our contributions secretary.)

**'Directed Giving'** is the term we use to describe gifts given to support individual budget items, as well as funds giving to support the work of our community ministries — the Lamorinda Adult Respite Center and Holy Shepherd Community Preschool.

'Designated Giving' is our label for gifts given to our mission partners (see the list above) which augment our budgeted support of their work. If you wish to gift one or more of those programs with a year-end gift, please include clear written instructions (via note or email) as to how you wish your gifts to be allocated.

Be aware that the IRS requires that all gifts recorded as 2023 charitable gifts must be received no later that December 31, 2023. And THANK YOU for your support of our congregation and its amazing work on behalf of the Gospel and the community in which we live and serve.
