Though Joan was hesitant to report an estimated date of completion, she did assure the Council that we would be able to celebrate a 'Grand Opening' of both our expanded preschool spaces and our renovated LARC spaces sometimes later this Fall. Joan gave a 'shoutout' to Tom Gilbertson and Steve Swanback for their steadfast efforts to rein in costs and press toward completion of the project. Thanks to all for their efforts in seeing this project through to completion.

On the evening of June 26th, LARC Program Director Kathleen Januszewski and Pastor John Valentine were invited to attend a reception hosted by the Community Foundation of Lafayette which honored impactful community service programs in the Lamorinda area — including our own Lamorinda Adult Respite Center!



Wow! We are feeling particularly grateful these days! The folks at the Community Foundation of Lafayette identified LARC as a 2024 Excellence Grant awardee — and generously gifted our program as the recipients of a \$5,000 gift in support of the daily operations of the LARC program! LARC was chosen after careful consideration for its stellar work done on behalf of some of our community's most vulnerable members.

Annually, the Community Foundation of Lafayette collects gifts from generous donors, business partners and sponsors, and then bundles those gifts to support local community

service programs.
