

WALKING TOGETHER THIS LENT

The season of Lent has long been a time for Christians to be 'stretched by the Spirit'. This year, it will also be a time for our congregation to practice being 'stretched by the Spirit', as we explore share a series on midweek worship opportunities with our faithful siblings at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Lafayette!

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians have recognized that the days we know as Holy Week and Easter are at the heart of our faith in the One True God. While Christmas may seem the big to-do in our society, it is in the days of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter that we discover the depths of God's love for us and all the world. And — because those days are at the center of our faith — the days leading up to Holy Week and Easter been identified as a time of preparation, and have been called the Season of Lent.



The Season of Lent is a time for us to "slow down". (In fact, the word 'Lent' literally means 'going slowly'.) Lent is a time to align our values with Jesus' values. Lent is a time to

stretch ourselves a bit and better conform our lives to his. Lent is a time to practice forgiveness, to embody community and to push ourselves to explore new ways of walking the journey of faith. This year, in addition to encouraging individual expressions of that Lenten spirit, we're taking on a Lenten discipline <u>as a community</u>. The year A.D. 2025 will see us sharing our midweek worship experiences (Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday) with the community that is Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Lafayette. In years now past (and under pastoral leaders now past), Holy Shepherd and Our Savior's have seen themselves as competitors. Perhaps this season of sharing may allow us to discover ways in which we might better live into the spirit of that high priestly prayer of Jesus recorded in John 17, ""May they be one, even as we are one."

Community Ministry Update:


Lutheran Social Services of Northern California



On February 2, 2025, Elon Musk and Michael Flynn slandered Lutherans nationwide with a lie so outrageous that it barely deserves a response — except that in today's world, where disinformation spreads like wildfire, the truth must be spoken, clearly and forcefully. The accusation? That Lutheran social service organizations (including our own mission partner LSS of Northern California) are engaged in "money laundering." Their accusation is not just false, it is an attack on people of faith who have dedicate their best energies to serving others — including foster children, refugees and homeless families.

Let us be crystal clear. Musk and Flynn's lies eroded trust, fueled suspicion, and endangered the very organizations that provide critical support to people in need. There is no money laundering. Lutheran social service organizations operate legally, transparently, and under strict government oversight. There is no profit motive. There is no slush fund. There is no scheme. There is just the work of caring for people in need — as LSS has done for more than 150 years. Through the work of LSS, we will continue to love our neighbors, even when it is difficult, even when it is unpopular, even when it comes at a cost. Because, as Dietrich Bonhoeffer once noted, the church is not the church unless it exists for others. (Excerpted of a letter by Bp. Jeff Johnson)

A memorial service honoring the life of Bob Valentine will be held at Holy Shepherd on Saturday, March 22nd at 10am and will be followed by a brunch reception. Please join the Valentine family that day as you are able!



A Word from Our Newly-Elected Congregational President — Joan Kiekhaefer

Dear Members and Friends of the Holy Shepherd Community,

"Change" has certainly been our watchword over these past few months! Some of that change has been exciting and long-awaited. Some of it has been challenging. And some of it has been down-right heartbreaking. But we trust that God is the One who is watching over our community, guiding our sometimes difficult decisions and providing that which we need. We grieve the loss of some beloved congregation members and leaders. While we know that we can't fill the holes left by their passings, we give thanks for those who have stepped up in service to continue the work that is underway.

The most anticipated update is that our Gregersen Hall construction project should finally be completed by the end of March, and our Holy Shepherd Community Preschool will be able to move into their shiny new classrooms. This will allow us to reclaim the CFM for "normal" church use during the week and for Sunday morning fellowship. An added benefit of that project is that our LARC program will have access to both a LARC staff-workroom and some expanded communal space for larger group activities. (Stay tuned for a formal celebration and dedication of those spaces once everyone has had a chance to move in.)

The completion of this project has brought with it a final accounting of the costs involved. We face the realization that the project took much longer than anticipated and cost significantly more than we initially forecasted. Changes to the State fire code required us to re-work architectural plans and install an active fire sprinkler system throughout the building, all of which caused delays and increased costs. We did also make some mistakes managing the project along the way. The result is that we have been forced to use a substantial portion of our financial reserves to cover cost overruns, and thus we will need to carefully focus on managing and reducing expenses in the short run.

The good news in all this is that we are confident that – with our robust Preschool and LARC programs – our long-term financial picture is strong. The difficult news is that, in the short term, we're going to have to do some significant belt-tightening. While we don't quite yet know what that means, our Finance Team is working to shape a financial plan that addresses our short-term challenges and provide us with a solid footing to begin rebuilding our reserves.
